### D-DAY IS COMING!

Believe it or not, draft day is barely over a month away. (Feb. 18-19) If the rest of you are anything at all like me, I suspect you have already put in a fair amount of time into draft preparation. I know I can't wait.

At this point, I know of seven people who will be in Chicago for the draft. (They are Kehlmeier, Gale, Wright, Klugh, Kolb, Taormina, and Nuest.) I know more of you are coming, but only those I mentioned are **definites**. As for the rest of you, if you could let me know when I can consider you as a definite, I would appreciate it.

Of the seven people I mentioned above who are definitely coming, only two are flying in. Tom Taormina was able to secure a very reasonable flight to and from Chicago (less than \$150) and Jim Klugh has generously decided to use a frequent flier bonus ticket to come to the draft. All of us attending the draft should say thanks to Jim for saving us some money. Jim certainly could have used that ticket on him or his family just as easily. However, having had the pleasure of being a fellow strat player with Jim in other leagues over the past four years, his selfless gesture does not surprise me in the least. We are all lucky to have him in our league. While I'm on the subject, Jim has also informed me he is willing to share a hotel room with someone to help reduce the cost. Anyone interested in cutting his hotel bill in half should call Jim and work out an arrangement.

Because the travel costs of the seven people who are definitely coming are so low, those of you who were on the fence as to whether you would come or not should give it some serious thought. Anyone who needs to fly in to get here will certainly be getting a great deal given the fact that all of us at the draft will share the costs.

### WHAT IF WE DONT FINISH?

The possibility that we will not complete the draft during the 18th and 19th does exist. I hope this is not the case, but we do need to be prepared all the same. Because the season starts only a month after the draft, we will need to pick a day soon after the 19th. Therefore, **if we do not finish** the draft over draft weekend, we will finish it, by phone, on Saturday, March 4th, starting at 10AM central standard time. I will conduct this portion of the draft, if it is necessary. Now I know some of you out there won't be able to participate due to other commitments. That is o.k. What you will have to do in that case is prepare a list and send it to me so I can draft the remainder of your team for you. Because any drafting we do on March 4th will be towards the tail end of the draft, you need not be too concerned that drafting by list

will disadvantage you to any great extent. March 4th is two weeks after our draft in Chicago. This will give time to anyone not available on the 4th to make up a list and send it to me. Hopefully, all this will be moot, and we will finish on the 19th. But if we need more time, we now have a plan.

I noticed that this month I received several messages from other league members via Vaughn Nuest. This seemed odd to me, but I guess I understand. Noone should be calling Vaughn anymore, unless it involves his team. It simply is not fair to Vaughn that he should be expected to be the conduit between league members and myself. If you need to bother anyone, it should be me. 'nuf said.

# **BRASSball Historian's Report**

## **Homes, Sweet Homes...**

I understand there was a 2 percentage point jump in BRASSland's GNP this year as a result of all the construction contracts handed out for building 24 new BRASSball franchise's ball parks. I'm happy to report that they were all completed ahead of schedule and should be ready for Opening Day festivities on April 1, 1995. A complete rundown of the new ball yards is enclosed in this mailing.

A few of them don't have names yet, but I'm sure they will in good time. These BRASSball owners are obviously holding out for the highest corporate bidder before granting naming rights. But I understand the fans in Racine, Wauwatosa, Tolar, Nashville and Madhatterville (wherever that is?) are each circulating "show a spine" petitions which call for the local baseball magnates to select from a variety of local heroes and not sell out to the highest bidder.

We'll see what happens with the name game on these franchise's parks.

## **Ball Park Analysis...**

The crafting of our home digs represents perhaps the final significant event in BRASSball history prior to the creation of our franchise rosters. Like all good baseball owners, the BRASSball franchise owners have duped the taxpayers into spending millions of dollars for these new palaces, thereby preserving the \$50,000,000 they have available for initial player salaries. Aren't we clever?

Now what's left is to match roster with ballpark and test your squad against every team in the league over 162 long games. With this in mind, I thought I'd add a little ball park analysis to our embryonic historical record this month. I hope you enjoy it.

With all the effort we've put into constructing a PBM league that tries to simulate real baseball as much as possible, it looks like the first evidence we have of that success is quite random and coincidental. If the ballparks are any indication, it appears as if BRASSball's AL and NL differences will simulate MLB's AL and NL differences. The power parks and power game will definitely be played in BRASSball's American League, while the National League has far more pitcher's parks. Anybody want to petition Kevin to abolish the DH in the NL?

Despite the more pitcher-friendly NL, it is clear that BRASSballers like offense. This is shown by looking at the weather-effect dimensions of the "average" BRASSball ball park. In the average park, singles are 10.8 and 10.0 for lefties and righties, respectively, while home runs are 12.9 for lefties and 11.9 for righties. On balance, every hitter will have better than

a 50-50 chance for a weather effect single or homer, in BRASSball play. Pity the poor pitchers. If BRASSball were real, the hurlers would never sign to play in our league!

Below are some interesting weather effect averages for teams in BRASSball, each league, and each division. The most offensive numbers (no pun intended) are highlighted in bold.

BRASSball AVERAGE: SI\*: 10.8 / 10.0 HR: 12.9 / 11.9

AMERICAN LEAGUE AVERAGE: SI\*: **11.7 / 10.6** HR: **14.0 / 13.6**

NATIONAL LEAGUE AVERAGE: SI\*: 9.9 / 9.4 HR: 11.8 / 10.1

AL WEST AVERAGE: SI\*: **17.3 / 13.9** HR: 14.3 / 13.2

AL CENTRAL AVERAGE: SI\*: 6.0 / 6.0 HR: **15.3 / 15.3**

AL EAST AVERAGE: SI\*: 11.8 / 11.8 HR: 12.3 / 12.3

NL WEST AVERAGE: SI\*: 10.0 / 9.5 HR: **12.3 / 11.5**

NL CENTRAL AVERAGE: SI\*: **11.6 / 12.1** HR: 11.1 / 10.6

NL EAST AVERAGE: SI\*: 8.2 / 6.7 HR: 12.1 / 8.3

As you can see from the chart above, the lowest average homer chance in an AL division is equal to the number that represents the highest average homer chance in an NL division. In all, a player is a full 26% more likely to nail a ball park homer split in an AL park, on average, than if he is in a NL park. What's more, he's almost 16% more likely to beat out a ballpark single in an AL park. Pretty interesting stuff--at least as far as weather effects go.

Not surprisingly, the top two hitters parks, the aptly named Homer Dome in Florida and Ocean Front Stadium at Santa Barbara, are both in the American League. While the top pitcher's park, Three Rivers Stadium (using the current MLB Pirates dimensions) being used by the Blind Lemons, is in the NL. Most of the rest of the pitcher's parks are in the NL as well. Sticking out like a sore thumb are the exceptions. The AL's Metro Dome, the ironically-named home to the AL East's Minnesota Mudcats, is an island in a sea of AL offense. And The Yard, home to the NL Central's Charlevoix Cutters, is one of the few dinger havens in the NL.

On the weather front, BRASSball has eleven domed stadiums where the elements never come into play. Of the 13 outdoor facilities, you are more likely to encounter good weather year-round in Santa Barbara than anywhere else. And the sun apparently never shines in Wauwatosa. The unnamed stadium there is more likely than all others to see bad weather.

### **Aw Shucks, Itwern't Nuthin'...**

I want to finish this report with a couple words for a surprising number of BRASSballers who have taken the time to acknowledge the hard work I put in to get the our new League off the ground. I've really been surprised at the number of complimentary notes and phone calls I've received since we rounded out the League's membership. I know it's a well-worn cliché, but it's apt. It really does make it worthwhile when people acknowledge and appreciate your efforts. Thanks for kind words, guys. Remember that Tom Taormina and Kevin played big roles as well. I hope we will all remember to acknowledge the work of the various League Administrative Team members every year too. Oh, the couple words?: **You're welcome!**
