2002 Free Agency Co\$tly

With the new salary system finally making its free agency debut it was expected that the 2002 class was going to reap huge financial benefits. Oh boy did they! I'm starting to wonder if BRASSball's new salary system was hatched by Don Fehr and not us owners. Mags Ordonez, Bob Abreu, Tim Hudson, Kerry Wood, Eric Chavez and Andruw Jones will all be making over six million dollars per season for the foreseeable future. Also of note was the lack of news coming from the compensation eligible players. Last off-season 11 of 15 such players switched teams. This class though only saw two compensation eligible players put on new duds- Kerry Wood and Ken Griffey Jr. Junior also had the distinction of being the last player on a contract from the original draft who had not experienced Free Agency. Way back in February of 1995 Junior was the Number One pick in the inaugural draft (for trivia buffs, Frank Thomas went second and Bonds third). 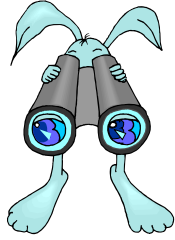
