### **POSTSEASON WRAPS UP**

It was down to the final four in the battle for BRASSball's first Championship. Top seeds Charlevoix and Long Island were set to get it on in the NLCS, while AL East Champ Hessville was primed to pull the upset against top seed Box City. While one series went down to the wire, another was four and out.

#### ***ALCS: Hessville Evereadys (96-66) vs Box City Parcelmen (106-56)***

Both teams showed up on a roll. Hessville needed only five games to blow by Social, while Box City stunned powerhouse Arlington in four. *Game 1* saw Cy Young candidates matched up. Jack McDowell (22-10, 3.32) for Hessville, while Ken Hill (22-6, 3.67) toed the rubber for host Box City. It was ugly. Hill tossed a two-hit shutout, walking three and whiffing four. Meanwhile, Bo Jackson and Jay Buhner had three hits each for the Parcelmen, and MVP candidate Barry Bonds homered, en route to a 10-0 pasting of Hessville. The Evereadys never recovered. Hessville sent 19-game winner John Smiley to the mound in *Game 2*, while Steve Ontiveros (8-5 3.44) went for Box. Smiley went the distance, allowing only 2 runs on eight hits, but it was not good enough. Ontiveros and Danny Cox held Hessville to 1 run on 7 hits, as they won 2-1, sweeping both home games. As if that wasn't enough, Box City stormed into Hessville and completed the 4-game blitz of the Evereadys. That made two straight sweeps for Box City in playoff competition. 8-0! On to the World Series!!

#### ***NLCS: Charlevoix Cutters (100-62) vs Long Island Tigers (107-55)***

After allowing 14 runs in only three innings in the opening round vs Nashville, Pedro Martinez (16-10 5.44) was awarded the opening game start for Charlevoix. He was opposed by Long Island's Mark Clark (8-7 4.04). Both teams were forced to seven games in the opening round, meaning Greg Maddux and Kevin Appier would have to wait to make their first NLCS appearances. And while Martinez was solid for the Cutters (8.1 IP, 7 hits, 9 k's, 2 runs), Clark was roughed up for 7 runs in 4 innings. Kirk Gibson's 3-run homer was all Charlevoix needed in this 7-2 win. Jeff Kent also drove in 3 for Charlevoix. In *Game 2*, the Cutters sent all-world Greg Maddux (27-9, 2.99) against Long Island's Kevin Appier (21-9, 4.34). Maddux, once again, was brilliant. A complete game, 2 hit, 4-1 victory. Palmeiro and Joe Carter homered for Charlevoix, as the Cutters headed home with a 2-0 series lead.

The visiting team dominance continued in *Game 3*, as the Tigers exploded off Cutter hurler Billy Swift (4 innings, 11 hits, 10 runs) in a 12-7 win. Tim Lincecum went 3 for 5, with a double, HR, and 5 RBI. John Smoltz was equally horrible for Long Island, but the Tiger bullpen came on early and shut the door. The Tigers looked to tie the series at 2 games, sending vet Orel Hershiser (10-10, 4.49) against P. Martinez. And as in *Game 3*, it was the Tim Lincecum show again. Lincecum went 4 for 5, with a double and RBI, and Delino Deshields went 2 for 4 with a HR and 3 RBI, as Long Island won it 7-4. Hershiser went 6 strong, allowing 6 hits and 3 runs. The Cutters sent Maddux out for *Game 5*, and Appier went again for the Tigers. And as in *Game 2*, Maddux was the story. In the Cutter 9-5 win, Maddux went the distance, with his only trouble spot coming in the 7th, when he allowed 4 of the 5 Tiger runs. John Olerud homered and drove in all 5 Tiger runs, but the Cutters were all over Appier, scoring 7 in the fourth, and the series was headed back to Long Island with the Cutters up 3 games to 2.

*Game 6* was do-or-die for Long Island, and they sent Mark Clark out for this key assignment. After getting shelled in *Game 1*, Clark turned in a beauty. However, he still trailed 1-0 after 7 innings, due to a great effort by David West and the Cutter pen. But the Tigers got one in the 8th, and in the ninth, mid-season acquisition Craig Shipley singled in the game winner off John Hudek, and it was on to *Game 7*. Henke got the win for Long Island.

**Game 7** Once again, the Cutters sent out P. Martinez, while the Tigers countered with John Smoltz. Charlevoix jumped out to a 4-0 lead in the first, and 8-1 after their half of the 4th. But Long Island fought back to tie the game at 8 after 7 innings. After Charlevoix made it 9-8 in the 8th, Long Island stormed

ahead with 3 in the bottom of the 8th, and went on to win the game 11-9. Frank Thomas homered twice in the final game, and the Tigers were World Series bound.

Heroes for Long Island in the series included Tim Lincecum (.300-2HR-9RBI), Frank Thomas (.308-2-7), and Delino DeShields (.421-1-5-3sbs). Maddux (2-0, 3.00) was super for the Cutters, but Pedro Martinez (1-1, 6.97) did little to help in his final two starts of the series. Kirk Gibson was the Cutter bright spot on offense, hitting .524 with 2HR and 6 RBI on the series.

So, as it should be, the best two teams in the regular season were set to battle in the first BRASSball World Series.

## WORLD SERIES

**Game 1:** Offense was the word of the day as the Series opened in Long Island. The Tigers trailed 8-3 early, but fought back off Ken Hill and won it 14-9. Kevin Appier (2IP, 8runs) stunk for the Tigers, but solid relief, namely from Jeff Montgomery (3IP, 0runs), enabled the Tigers to come back. Frank Thomas drove in three runs, leading a balanced Tiger attack. Barry Bonds went 3 for 5 with 3 RBI for Box, but it wasn't enough.

**Game 2:** Amazing performances by starters Steve Ontiveros and Orel Hershiser. Tied 2-2 after 9 innings, the Tigers allowed Hershiser out to start the 10th. Orel retired two hitters, but needed help by Rich Rodriguez to get out unscathed. Box City also allowed its starter Ontiveros out for the 10th. After retiring two hitters, Steve made the mistake. He hung one to Big Frank, who took it deep for the game winning HR. It was Thomas's third hit of the day. For Ontiveros(9 2/3IP, 8 hits, 3 runs), a tough one to swallow. Even tougher, a 2-0 deficit for a team which had yet to lose a playoff game before this Series began.

**Game 3:** Box City sent knuckleballer Tom Candiotti out in this must-win situation. Smoltz got the call for the Tigers. Barry Bonds and Lenny Webster went deep off Smoltz, leading to this 6-4 Parcelmen win. Candiotti was wild, walking 5 in just under 5 innings. But solid relief by Hesketh, Ryan, and Danny Cox made the difference. After three, Tigers up 2-1.

**Game 4:** Ken Hill rebounded nicely from his poor effort in Game 1, while Kevin Appier was even worse, as Box City tied the series at 2 games. In this 5-3 win, all 5 Parcelmen runs scored in the first, as Appier was knocked out early. Bo Jackson's 2-run HR, and Leo Gomez's bases loaded double, were all Hill (8IP, 3runs) needed. Cox earned his 2nd straight save, and the Series was headed for a key Game 5 situation.

**Game 5:** Looking to sweep all 3 home games, the Parcelmen went with Erik Hanson, while Long Island came with Mark Clark. Bo Jackson and Barry Bonds each homered and drove in 4 runs, and Hanson went 6 2/3 strong innings for Box, as they completed the 3-game home sweep, 9-3. Back to Long Island, where the Tigers hoped to keep up the home team dominance in this series.

**Game 6:** The Tigers needed another big effort by Mr. Hershiser in this one, and they got it. Orel went 6 stong, as Long Island won it 4-3. Box City took a quick 2-0 lead, but a 4-run 5th keyed the Tigers win. Steve Ontiveros was tough, but took the L anyway. And so, it was down to one game for all the marbles.

**GAME 7:** Appier vs. Hill, one last time. It was 2-0 after one, as Long Island got to Hill early. But in the 2nd, Box City bounced back with a three spot, thanks in part to Bo Jackson's 2 run HR, his 3rd in 4 games. Sorrento added a solo shot to make it 4-2 after 5. Long Island knocked Hill(7 1/3, 7hits, 3runs) from the game in the bottom of the 8th, making it 4-3. Danny Cox came on in the bottom of the 9th to preserve the win, his third save of the series, and the Box City Parcelmen had won the first ever BRASSball title on enemy ground. Bo Jackson was the MVP, hitting .296 with 3HR and 10 RBI for the series. Barry Bonds pulled his weight as well, with a .273-2-11-3SB performance. Frank Thomas (.346-3-11) finished his MVP season with a bang, but he and the Tigers came up just short. **Congrats to the BOX CITY PARCELMEN**, who went **12-3** in postseason competition! Quite a performance by a great team.

PARCELMEN PRESS RELEASE...

BO JACKSON, IN A NEWS CONFERENCE TODAY, ANNOUNCED THAT HE WOULD BE RETIRING FROM BRASSBALL. JACKSON SAID " BEING ON A WORLD SERIES WINNER HAS MADE MY CAREER FULFILLED". "I DON'T HAVE ANYTHING ELSE I NEED TO PROVE TO ANYONE". "I WANT TO GO HOME AND JUST SPEND SOME TIME WITH MY FAMILY". BOX CITY'S MANAGER, LENNY LUCHTEFELD SAID "BO WILL BE GREATLY MISSED". JACKSON STARTED HIS BRASSBALL CAREER WITH CHARLEVOIX, A 19TH ROUND PICK, BUT WAS TRADED TO BOX CITY IN MAY OF 1995. JACKSON AND JOHN DETTMER WENT TO THE PARCELMEN FOR RELIEF PITCHER DARREN HALL. "IT WAS A BENIFCIAL TRADE, IT IMPROVED OUR OFFENSE AND THEIR PITCHING" SAID LUCHTEFELD. SINCE COMING OVER FROM CHALEVOIX, JACKSON BATTED .270 WITH 16 HOMERS AND 57 RBI'S IN 58 GAMES.

JACKSON ALSO HAD A TREMENDOUS POST SEASON, CAPED OFF WITH A WORLD SERIES VICTORY. BO PLAYED IN 15 GAMES, BATTED .321 WITH 6 HOMERS AND 17 RBI'S. HE WAS NAMED CO WORLD SERIES MVP WITH DANNY COX.

JACKSON IS RETIRING AT THE RIPE OLD AGE OF 32. HE SHOULD HAVE PLENTY OF TIME TO SPEND WITH HIS FAMILY. WE WILL MISS YOU BO JACKSON. GOOD LUCK IN THE FUTURE.

A LOOK BACK....

WHEN THIS LEAGUE WAS BEING CREATED, I WAS ASKED BY VAUGHN, KEVIN AND TOM TO BE A MEMBER. I WAS ALREADY A MEMBER OF THE SISTER LEAGUE (BRASS) AND I KNEW IT WAS VERY SUCCESSFUL. I WAS EXCITED ABOUT THE POSSIBILITY OF A NEW LEAGUE THAT WAS STARTING FROM SCRATCH. HERE WAS A CHANCE TO DRAFT A TEAM FROM THE GROUND UP AND MAKE IT MY OWN. I THOUGHT I WAS IN HEAVEN! NOW THE PLAYOFFS BEGIN AND ARLINGTON WOULD BE BACK IN TOWN AS THE WILDCARD REPRESENTATIVE. THE THOROUGHBREDS HAD MADE SOME EXCELENT TRADES DURING THE YEAR AND WERE A VERY POWERFUL TEAM. COLBY AND I PLAYED OUR GAMES OVER THE PHONE. THAT WAS NEXT BEST THING TO FACE TO FACE. I WON THE FIRST 2 GAMES AT HOME. WE THEN PLAYED AT ARLINGTON'S PARK BUT THE RESULTS WERE THE SAME. I HAD WON MY FIRST PLAYOFF SERIES IN BRASSBALL 4 GAMES TO NONE.

THE NEXT OPPONENT WOULD BE HESSVILLE. HE HAD BEATEN SO. CAL. 4 GAMES TO 1 TO ADVANCE. THE EVEREADYS CAME TO TOWN WITH EXCELLENT DEFENSE, GOOD PITCHING AND A BALANCED

OFFENSE. JIM AND I PLAYED OUR GAMES BY MAIL. I STARTED AT HOME AND WON GAME 1 HANDILY. GAME 2 WAS A DOG FIGHT. ONTIVEROS WITH HELP FROM RYAN AND COX HELD ON FOR A 2-1 WIN. I NOW LEAD 2-0 IN THE SERIES. THE PLAYOFFS THEN MOVED TO HIS HOME FIELD. UNFORTUNATELY FOR JIM, THE RESULTS WERE THE SAME. BOX CITY TOOK BOTH GAMES AT HIS PLACE, FOR A 4-0 SWEEP.

I HAD WENT 8-0 SO FAR IN THE PLAYOFFS. HOW LONG COULD I KEEP THIS UP? I WAS NOW PLAYING FOR THE FIRST WORLD SERIES TITLE IN BRASSBALL HISTORY. I NOW WOULD FACE LONG ISLAND. GAME 4, THE BOX CITY BOYS JUMPED OUT WITH 5 IN THE 1ST INNING AND CRUSIED TO A 5-3 WIN. IN GAME 5, BO JACKSON HIT A GRAND SLAM IN THE 7TH TO ICE A 9-3 VICTORY. I NOW LEAD 3 GAMES TO 2. WE WENT BACK TO LONG ISLAND FOR GAMES 6 AND 7. GAME 6, BOX CITY COULDN'T SHUT DOWN THE TIGERS IN THE 5TH WHEN THEY SCORED 4 RUNS. HERSHISER WITH HELP FROM RUFFIN CLOSED THE DOOR AND SAVED A 4-3 WIN. THE WHOLE SEASON CAME DOWN TO 1 GAME. THE TIGERS JUMPED OUT IN FRONT 2-0 IN THE 1ST INNING. THE PARCELMEN RESPONDED IN THE 2ND AS JACKSON AND SORRENTO HIT BACK TO BACK HOMERS TO GIVE US A 3-2 LEAD. WE ADDED ANOTHER TALLY IN THE 5TH TO GO UP 4-2. LONG ISLAND RALLIED AND SCORED 1 RUN IN THE 8TH. HILL WAS PITCHING WELL BUT GAVE WAY TO HERNANDEZ AFTER 7 AND 1/3, WHO SHUT DOWN THE TIGERS. IT HAD NOW COME DOWN TO THE BOTTOM OF THE 9TH. I HAD MADE ALL THE MOVES I COULD. I HAD MY BEST DEFENSIVE PLAYERS IN AND DANNY COX, MY BEST RELIEVER, WAS ON THE MOUND TO CLOSE THE DOOR. IT WAS WIN OR LOSE AT THIS POINT. LONG ISLAND STARTED OFF WITH SINGLE BY SHIPLEY. I STARTED TO HAVE VISIONS OF THE WORST. CURTIS PINCH RAN FOR SHIPLEY. BLOWERS LINED OUT.
